



All India Impact Based Weather Warning Bulletin

Sunday 01 August 2021
Time of Issue: 2000 hours IST

(Night)

01 August (Day 1): ♦ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with Extremely Heavy Falls** at isolated places likely over Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh; **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** at isolated places over Uttarakhand, West Uttar Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and **Heavy rainfall** at isolated places over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, East Uttar Pradesh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, Bihar, Assam & Meghalaya and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura.

♦ **Strong winds (speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** very likely over Southwest & Westcentral Arabian Sea and **(speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** over North Arabian Sea along & off Gujarat-Maharashtra coasts. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

02 August (Day 2): ♦ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** at a few places **with Extremely Heavy Falls** at isolated places very likely over East Rajasthan; **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall with Extremely Heavy Falls** at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** at isolated places over Uttarakhand, West Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim and **Heavy rainfall** at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, West Rajasthan, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Bihar and Assam & Meghalaya.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, Bihar and Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.

♦ **Strong winds (speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** very likely over Southwest & Westcentral Arabian Sea and **(speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** over North Arabian Sea along & off Gujarat-Maharashtra coasts. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

03 August (Day 3): ♦ **Heavy to Very Heavy Rainfall** at isolated places very likely over East Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh and **Heavy rainfall** at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal and Konkan & Goa.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.

♦ **Strong winds (speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** very likely over Southwest & Westcentral Arabian Sea and **(speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** over North Arabian Sea along & off Gujarat-Maharashtra coasts. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

04 August (Day 4): ♦ **Heavy Rainfall** at isolated places likely over Himachal Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Coastal Karnataka and Konkan & Goa.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.

♦ **Strong winds (speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** very likely over Southwest & Westcentral Arabian Sea and **(speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** over North Arabian Sea along & off Gujarat-Maharashtra coasts. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

05 August (Day 5): ♦ **Heavy Rainfall** at isolated places likely over Himachal Pradesh, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal, Odisha, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala & Mahe and Konkan & Goa.

♦ **Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning** very likely at isolated places over Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.


♦ **Strong winds (speed 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph)** very likely over Southwest & Westcentral Arabian Sea and **(speed 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph)** over North Arabian Sea along & off Gujarat-Maharashtra coasts. Fishermen are advised not to venture into these areas.

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EXPECTED IMPACT & ACTION SUGGESTED due to Extremely Heavy Rainfall over West Rajasthan and East Madhya Pradesh on 01st and East Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh on 01st & 02nd August, 2021.

A. Impact Expected

- Localized Flooding of roads, water logging in low lying areas and closure of underpasses mainly in urban areas of the above region.
- Occasional reduction in visibility due to heavy rainfall.
- Disruption of traffic in major cities due to water logging in roads leading to increased travel time.
- Minor damage to kutcha roads.
- Possibilities of damage to vulnerable structure.
- Localized Landslides/Mudslides
- Damage to horticulture and standing crops in some areas due to inundation.
- It may lead to riverine flooding in some river catchments (for riverine flooding please visit Web page of CWC)

B. Action Suggested

- Check for traffic congestion on your route before leaving for your destination.
- Follow any traffic advisories that are issued in this regard.
- Avoid going to areas that face the water logging problems often.
- Avoid staying in vulnerable structure.

When maximum temperature of a station reaches $\geq 40^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\geq 30^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
(a) Based on Departure from normal

Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Heat Wave: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq 6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b). Based on Actual maximum temperature

Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 45^{\circ}\text{C}$.
Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature $\geq 47^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c). Criteria for heat wave for coastal stations

When maximum temperature departure is $> 4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ from normal. Heat Wave may be described provided maximum temperature $\geq 37^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When maximum temperature remains 40°C

Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure 4.5°C to 6.4°C .
Severe Warm Night: When minimum temperature departure $> 6.4^{\circ}\text{C}$.



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions.
(a). Based on departure

Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Wave: Minimum Temperature Departure from normal $\geq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$

(b) Based on actual Minimum Temperature (for Plains only)

Cold Wave : When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 4.0^{\circ}\text{C}$
Severe Cold Wave: When Minimum Temperature is $\leq 2.0^{\circ}\text{C}$

(c) For Coastal Stations

When Minimum Temperature departure is $\leq -4.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ or actual Minimum Temperature is $\leq 15^{\circ}\text{C}$



When minimum temperature of a station $\leq 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ for plains and $\leq 0^{\circ}\text{C}$ for hilly regions
Based on departure

Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal -4.5°C to -6.4°C .
Severe Cold Day: Maximum Temperature Departure from normal $\leq -6.5^{\circ}\text{C}$



Phenomenon of small droplets suspended in air and the horizontal visibility $< 1\text{km}$

Moderate Fog: When the visibility between 500-200 metres
Dense Fog: when the visibility between 50-200 metres
Very Dense Fog: when the visibility < 50 metres



Sudden electrical discharges manifested by a flash of light (Lightning) and a sharp rumbling sound (thunder)



An ensemble of particles of dust or sand energetically lifted to great heights by a strong and turbulent wind.



Ice deposits on ground

Air temperature $\leq 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ (over Plains)



A strong wind that rises suddenly, lasts for atleast 1 minute.

Moderate: Wind speed 52-61 kmph
Severe: Wind speed 62-87 kmph
Very Severe: Wind speed > 87 kmph



Effect of various waves in the sea over specific area

Rough to very rough: Wind speed 41-62 kmph (22-33 knots) & Wave height 2.5-6 metre
High to very high: Wind speed 63-117 kmph (34-63 knots) & Wave height 6-14 metre
Phenomenal: Wind speed > 117 kmph (> 63 knots) & Wave height > 14 metre



Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 62-87 kmph (34-47 knots)

Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 88-117 kmph (48-63 knots)

Very Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 118-165 kmph (64 - 89 knots)

Extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm: Wind speed 166-220 kmph (90 -119 knots)

Super Cyclone Storm: Wind speed > 220 kmph (> 119 knots)

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
